
# Why Vote?


### MNPL - IAM's Political Arm

# We're Not the Only Ones Involved in Politics


- Special interest groups are at work constantly trying to limit our protections & rights
- They have the dollars and the highpriced personnel to influence lawmakers both state & federal

### Where PAC Dollars Come



1998 Total Labor PAC Contributions = \$58.1 million (8.2%) vs Corporations - \$653.4 million (91.8%)

### Where PAC Dollars Come From



2005 Total Corporations Contributions - \$1.5 Billion (96%) vs Labor - \$61.7 Million (4%)
