NFFE President Randy Erwin Co-hosts Teleconference with U.S. Senators and Unions to Plan COVID-19 Next Steps

On Friday, NFFE National President Randy
Erwin co-hosted a federal labor conference call
with Maryland Senators Ben Cardin and Chris
Van Hollen to plan the next steps for legislation
to address the growing COVID-19 crisis.
Senators Cardin and Van Hollen serve as
stalwarts for federal employees in the senate,
often leading the charge to improve the lives and
careers of the civilian workforce that serves the
American people. The conference call last
Friday proved to be no different as both senators
agreed with federal labor leaders that much must
be done quickly to improve the safety and
effectiveness of the COVID-19 response across
the government.

President Erwin talked with the senators along with other labor leaders at great length and in very specific detail about the impact that the lack of government guidance and preparedness has had on agencies, federal employees, NFFE members, and the public.

"This administration has dropped the ball more than once," stated President Erwin on the call. "In no uncertain terms, the White House left the federal workforce largely on its own, failing to provide the leadership, response policies, and the protective equipment needed to keep the government running safely and effectively. Sadly, we have already seen federal employees die from the coronavirus, and we will see more deaths before this pandemic is over. We must do better. What we've seen is completely unacceptable."

Discussions continue with Senate and House leaders on a legislative package meant to improve agency reporting, engage management communications, install proper safety and equipment at facilities, expand telework and leave policies, increase hazard pay eligibility, provide child care assistance and other workforce initiatives to help federal employees and their families through the COVID-19 pandemic crisis.
